Report on the Study Tour Conducted by the Dept. of History-2024

The Department of History organized a highly educational and engaging study tour on the 18th of January, 2024. The tour commenced at 10:00 AM from the college premises, and a total of 29 enthusiastic students from the department participated. Accompanying them were Sri Sajal Nama, Assistant Professor and Head of the Department (In-Charge), and Sri Raju Debnath, Assistant Professor, both of whom acted as guides and facilitators for the trip. The destination of this educational tour was the historic site of Pilak, an archaeological treasure located in the Santirbazar subdivision of the South Tripura district in the Indian state of Tripura. Pilak is renowned for its ancient heritage and serves as a significant site for understanding the interplay of Buddhist and Hindu sects. Over the years, numerous antiquities and structures dating back to the 8th to 12th centuries have been unearthed here, shedding light on the region's cultural and religious diversity during that period. Since 1927, the site has been a focal point for archaeological exploration and discovery, with findings that offer profound insights into the art, architecture, and spiritual practices of the past.

The students were particularly eager to explore the sandstone sculptures that Pilak is famous for. These sculptures, representing a synthesis of Buddhist and Hindu iconography, reflect a heterodox culture that thrived between the 9th and 13th centuries. The trip provided an opportunity for students to observe firsthand the intricacies of ancient craftsmanship and to appreciate the harmonious coexistence of diverse religious traditions in historical contexts. Many of the sculptures and artifacts from Pilak are displayed at the Museum, which the group also visited as part of the tour.

Upon reaching Pilak, the students and teachers were greeted by a local guide, who provided detailed explanations about the site's significance and its archaeological discoveries. The guide's in-depth knowledge and engaging storytelling captivated the group, sparking curiosity and enriching their understanding of the historical and cultural importance of the site. artistic capabilities of the era. Additionally, the students explored the ruins of ancient structures, further deepening their appreciation of the architectural heritage of the region.

The visit to the Museum was another highlight of the tour. Here, the students were able to view an extensive collection of artifacts excavated from Pilak and other sites in the region. The exhibits of the museum included detailed descriptions of the sculptures, inscriptions, coins and other relics, allowing the students to connect the physical artifacts with the historical narratives they had studied in their courses. This immersive experience helped bridge the gap between theoretical learning and real-world observation, making history come alive for the participants.

Throughout the tour, the students and teachers expressed excitement and enthusiasm for the opportunity to learn outside the classroom. The hands-on experience of exploring an archaeological site and engaging with historical artifacts fostered a deeper appreciation for history as a discipline.
