



Analysis of Feedback on Training & Placement Cell

The feedback suggests **significant gaps** in the Training & Placement (T&P) Cell's efforts. Below is an analysis of each question and recommendations for improvement.

Key Observations:

- 1. On-Campus Placement (No)
 - o The institution does not provide on-campus placement opportunities.
 - o This is a major drawback, as on-campus recruitment helps students secure jobs without external competition.
- 2. Off-Campus Placement (No)
 - o No sufficient off-campus placement support is provided either.
 - A lack of assistance for job searches forces students to look for opportunities on their own.
- 3. Career Counseling & Higher Studies Guidance (No)
 - Students have not availed career counseling or guidance services.
 - This suggests either **poor awareness** or **ineffective implementation** of these services.
- 4. Willingness to Engage with Juniors (Yes)
 - Alumni are interested in delivering guest lectures, motivational talks, and special sessions.
 - o This presents an opportunity to strengthen alumni involvement in career development.
- 5. Interest in Alumni Association (Yes)
 - o Alumni are willing to join the Alumni Association.
 - A well-structured alumni network can support job placements and mentoring.
- 6. Participation in Alumni Meets (Yes)
 - o Alumni have participated in alumni meets, indicating engagement with the institution.
- 7. Receiving College Communications (Yes)
 - o Alumni receive communication via emails, calls, or SMS.
 - This is a positive aspect, ensuring that alumni remain connected.

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Recommendations for Improvement:

1. Strengthen the Placement Process

- Establish Partnerships with companies for on-campus recruitment drives.
- Offer Resume Building & Interview Preparation workshops.
- Create a Dedicated Placement Portal for job postings and applications.
- Encourage Internships to enhance employability before graduation.

2. Develop Off-Campus Support

- Organize **job fairs** with partner industries.
- Facilitate **networking sessions** between students and recruiters.
- Provide **regular job notifications** and placement assistance.

3. Enhance Career Counseling & Higher Studies Guidance

- Conduct career guidance sessions for students interested in higher education.
- Introduce mock interviews and aptitude test training.
- Develop mentorship programs where alumni guide students on career paths.

4. Utilize Alumni Willingness

- Arrange guest lectures and motivational sessions by alumni.
- Establish a mentorship system connecting alumni with students.
- Encourage alumni to refer students for job openings in their companies.

5. Strengthen the Alumni Association

- Organize regular alumni meets for networking.
- Use the association to facilitate internship and placement opportunities.
- Leverage social media platforms like LinkedIn & WhatsApp groups for job postings.

By implementing these changes, the Training & Placement Cell can significantly improve its services and increase student employability.
